



Fortune and Glory: Tantalizing Twenty-Seven- Janet Evanovich (BCD)


The Searcher by Tana French (BCD)


Eleanor by David Michaelis (BCD)


Squeeze Me by Carl Hiaasen (BCD)


A Private Cathedral by James Lee Burke (BCD)


All the Devils are Here by Louise Penny (BCD)
